Along Side Hope (former PWRDF) – Submitted by Lynne Spiring-Whitten

In parts of Mozambique and Madagascar, every night, women give birth in the dark. With unreliable or nonexistent electricity, nurses and midwives sometimes use lamps or flashlights to deliver babies.
